

Professional Dress Guide

Vail Internship Program

You do not need to purchase a whole new outfit for your Vail Internship Program interview. Shop your closet or borrow from a friend to create an outfit that meets the parameters below and allows you to feel confident. Overall, you want your outfit to enhance, not distract, from your professional skills and interview performance.

- Your clothing should be neat and ironed
- Slacks should be well fitted, not overly loose or tight
- Skirts should be knee length when standing, thighs covered while seated
- Button down, collared shirts should be ironed and worn with a tie
- Ties should just barely graze your belt buckle
- Suit jackets are optional
- Tops should be modest, avoid low cut or spaghetti straps
- Avoid overly bright patterns and colors, think solid, neutral, and dark
- Closed toed heels, flats or dress shoes should be worn
- Avoid overly tall heels (2.5 inches or less) or shoes you are not comfortable walking in
- Hair should be well groomed
- Nails and makeup should be natural and minimal
- Use perfume or body spray sparingly, if at all
- Jewelry should be simple and not distracting
- Piercings and tattoos should be covered or removed (always align to company culture or standards)
- No jeans, shorts, sundresses, or athletic wear
